





Hometown of Hevelius, Fahrenheit, Schopenhauer, Grass, and Lech Wałęsa

The massive brick bulk of St Mary's Basilica towering over the city, the Medieval Crane dozing off stooped on the Motława bank, the Long Market with Neptune's Fountain what is acclaimed one of the most beautiful market places in Europe

August 1980, strike in the Gdańsk Shipyard led by Lech Wałęsa and creation of Solidarity, a great social movement, captured imagination of millions

Today's Gdańsk is a modern, European metropolis, economy based on knowledge, actively developing centre of culture, science, entertainment and sport, attractive tourist destination and the world capital of amber. Not without a reason Gdańsk, was one of the Host Cities of the UEFA EURO 2012™ - European Football Championship.


